Overview and Schedule

McGeorge offers one of the largest field placement and judicial externship programs of any ABA-accredited law school. Coupled with our Capital location, you will enjoy opportunities to earn academic credit, resume-building experience, and networking opportunities through placements at more than 150 state and federal courts, government agencies and nonprofit entities, and limited for-profit opportunities.

Placements are available to any student who has satisfactorily completed their first year and is not on academic probation. Placements are generally 3 units; limited part-time and full-time placements (7 and 14 units) are available upon pre-planning with the Director of Field Placement. Most placements are located in the Sacramento region. Domestic and international placements are available outside of the Sacramento area, but require pre-approval and advance planning.

During their placement, students perform on-site legal work under supervision and attend on-campus reflective classes with professors. Colleen Truden, Director of Field Placement, and David James, Senior Career Advisor, counsel students regarding appropriate placements and approve each student's enrollment.

Fall & Spring Application and Registration Process

- 1) Review the Directory of Placements and resources on the Field Placement Sakai page.
- 2) The Field Placement Notice of Intent form must be submitted by **May 31, 2013 (found at go.mcgeorge.edu/fieldplacements)**.
(Note: Late submissions are discouraged, but may be considered on a case-by-case basis).
- 3) Send separate application packet emails to sacexternships@pacific.edu by the deadlines below. Each packet must include your cover letter and resume, and any other documents required by the Placement. (Review the Directory of Field Placements for this information. PDF version preferred.)
- 4) The Field Placement Office will review and send your application packets to the placements. If the placement is interested, they will contact you directly regarding an interview.
- 5) After you accept a placement: Notify the Field Placement Office and complete the "Field Placement Registration Form."
