RE: Executive Order on Immigration and Planning for Increased Immigration Enforcement Actions.

DATE: January 30, 2017

Since before the Inauguration, we have been receiving calls requesting legal advice and assistance for Immigrants worried about being detained and/or deported. In addition to basic legal rights and remedies about deportation itself, there is a need for planning to handle financial and property affairs as well as child guardianships.

Because we are at capacity in individual representation in our Immigration Clinic, we are offering the following public educational and information events.
